
I am J.

An inspiring story of self-discovery, of choosing to stand up for yourself, and of finding your own path - readers will recognize a part of themselves in J's struggle to love his true self.


"Hola, Jeni."

The Perks of being a wallflower.




Welcome to the world of the Grisha.

Naomi & Ely's no kiss list.




When Cameron Post's parents die suddenly in a car crash, her shocking first thought is relief. Relief they'll never know that, hours earlier, she had been kissing a girl.




Will Grayson, Will Grayson.


They both die at the end.

It's a kind of funny story.



Ned Vizzini, who himself spent time in a psychiatric hospital, has created a remarkably moving tale about the sometimes unexpected road to happiness.


Alex in Wonderland.

Noah can't even.



Boy meets boy.






This is a happy-meaningful romantic comedy about finding love, losing love, and doing what it takes to get love back in a crazy-wonderful world.




Through rallies and marches, in polite drawing rooms and freezing prison cells and the poverty-stricken slums of the East End, three courageous young women join the fight for the vote.




Heartstopper.

Carry on.




Simon Snow is the worst Chosen One who's ever been chosen.



Nelson Glassman is "out" to the entire world, but he can't tell the boy he loves that he wants to be more than just friends.




The Gender games.



Girl hearts girl.





Within months, they began a long distance relationship, finally meeting in the summer of 2011. Lucy's video montage of their first week spent together in Saint Kitts, which she posted to the couple's YouTube channel, was the first in a series of films documenting their long-distance relationship. Funny, tender and candid, the films attracted them a vast online following. Now, for the first time, Lucy's writing about the incredible personal journey she's been on; from never quite wanting the fairy-tale of Prince Charming to realising she was gay at the age of 14, through three years of self-denial to finally coming out to friends and family, to meeting her American girlfriend Kaelyn.

Beyond Magenta: Transgender teens speak out.



Author and photographer Susan Kuklin met and interviewed six transgender or gender-neutral young adults and used her considerable skills to represent them thoughtfully and respectfully before, during, and after their personal acknowledgment of gender preference. Portraits, family photographs, and candid images grace the pages, augmenting the emotional and physical journey each youth has taken. Each honest discussion and disclosure, whether joyful or heart-breaking, is completely different from the other because of family dynamics, living situations, gender, and the transition these teens make in recognition of their true selves.
